

SCHOOL STATEMENT

Emmaus Catholic Primary School is situated in the beautiful Swan Valley, an area which is rich in its cultural diversity and population. We warmly welcome all families from all cultures who seek a Catholic education for their children. Our school is a place for learning, connecting, developing, transforming and journeying together.

Emmaus Catholic Primary School was established in 2023 and is located in Dayton, Western Australia. The school is situated on the site of the old Riverlands Montessori, School which closed in December, 2020. Currently the school is a co-educational single stream school, with the goal of becoming a double stream school in the future. In 2023 the school catered for children from 3-Year-Old Kindergarten to Year 6. The school commenced day one with 102 students and finished the year with 141 students enrolled. The school had a staff of 20.

The Parents and Friends (P&F) Committee has been an integral part in creating our positive community atmosphere within the school. As Principal, I am very proud and fortunate to have a hard-working School Advisory Council working cooperatively with the P&F for the betterment of the school and its students. The time and commitment that these people give to our community is to be commended. The school has a very strong bond and great working relationship with the Parish and Parish Priest. Our Parish Priest is present in the school, and this benefits the students, parents and staff. It is imperative that these relationships are maintained within the school.

Our staff are highly professional, experienced, dedicated, motivated, and committed to supporting each student and meeting their individual educational needs. We acknowledge that parents, as the child's first educators, make a vital and valuable contribution to the education of their children. We look forward to working in close partnership with our parents. Together, we deliver a Christ-centred and child focused education of the highest quality.

Our motto, 'Journeying Together', reminds us that for many students and their families, Emmaus Catholic Primary School will be where they encounter and journey with Jesus as part of their experience of school life. We work interactively with all stakeholders as a community of faith to nourish and deepen relationships with Christ to make an authentic difference in every student's life journey. For many of our students this is their first Catholic school and also their first school in Australia.

PARENT, STUDENT AND STAFF SATISFACTION

Emmaus Catholic Primary School commenced operating in 2023. Although no survey was taken for our community, we did hold conversations with our parents (interviews), students and staff (20 minute rounds – these are 20 minute fortnightly meetings between staff and leadership. 1:1 meetings). The majority of all community members were very happy with what the school had to offer and at the way the school had commenced.

Parents were very happy with the way their children had quickly settled into their new school. This was considering moving from another school and not knowing other students. Parents said that their children were happy and felt safe at school. They liked their teachers and were happy to make new friends. New families to Western Australia felt that the school was a special place for their children and felt that they were fortunate to have been accepted into Emmaus Catholic Primary School. Parents were also very supportive of our newly formed P&F Committee and supported this group greatly. This saw tremendous community building within the school. Families attended many functions that the P&F organised and at the same time we saw new families forming friendships.

Students said that they liked the small number of children in their classrooms and thought that their teachers were caring and good teachers. The students loved the open space (oval) and loved how everyone played with each other, students from Year 1 to Year 5. The smaller children loved having the bigger kids to play with as they were like their older brothers and sisters caring for them. The students did say that they would have liked some variety of sports and to attend more carnivals especially against other schools.

Our staff are a very resilient group of people, considering some of the conditions of their classrooms. Although some did stress concern with some of the conditions, they persevered through this and performed professionally. Staff were very satisfied with the support from leadership and united as a group to support each other when needed. Staff felt that the resources that the school had purchased and maintained from Riverlands Montessori School, were great resources and looked forward to the school using more of these resources into the future. The staff felt that the wellbeing of staff and students was a highlight and main focus of the school. The UR Strong initiative and program introduced into the school was found to be very beneficial to the students. Two more wellbeing initiatives will be introduced in 2024 for students.

Staff also appreciated various functions and initiatives that were introduced by our Wellbeing Committee.
